Gaining our inheritance

Joshua 7:1-12

1. Fighting for our inheritance

When Joshua stood outside Jericho, God said, “See, I have delivered Jericho into your hands”(Josh 1:6); However, Joshua still had to lead his people into battle to secure their inheritance. How does this provide motivation for us to also fight for our inheritance? What are some of the ways in which we can step out and take action as a Life Group?

2. Seeking God for our inheritance

Joshua failed to seek God before attempting to take Ai. Why is it important we avoid becoming complacent with our approach to significant challenges? Spend some time praying together for the offering this Sunday, asking God for a sense of faith and clarity in how you might contribute.

3. Living for our inheritance

God made it very clear that it was because of Achan’s sin that the people of Israel did not receive a victory (Josh 7:12). The truth is that our devotion to God matters much more to Him than accomplishing things for Him. In what way does this impact our approach to worship through giving? How can we make sure our hearts are right when offering worship to God?

4. Resisting compromise for our inheritance

Achan compromised himself because instead of thirsting after God, he coveted possessions that he thought would give him a sense of identity, security and happiness. The truth is, God is the only one who satisfies. What are some of the challenges of living in London and fighting the temptation to crave material possessions? Discuss ways in which we can overcome this temptation, and instead thirst after an inheritance from God?
